Preparing your Motorcycle for Shipment

Motorcycle Wash: Please provide the motorcycle in clean condition. This allows for quick and fair evaluation of the motorcycle prior to shipment.

Antennas: Antennas should be lowered or removed. Temporary antennas for cells phones or CB radios should also be removed.

Steering: Make sure the steering is unlocked and the keys are removed.

Mirrors: If possible, fold the mirrors in.

Alarms: Alarms should be turned off for transport. If there are special instructions required to start a motorcycle in order to disarm the alarm, please advise our office and the driver picking up your motorcycle. VRS is not responsible for drained batteries resulting from an alarm that has not been turned off.

Climate: Make sure your motorcycle is prepared for any climate. Replenish coolants, transmission oil, anti-freeze and other fluids, as needed. VRS is not responsible for preventable damage caused by Acts of Nature.

Personal Items: Do not leave or transport anything valuable in your motorcycle. VRS is not responsible for any personal items. The U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT) prohibits the carrying of personal items on a truck licensed only for carrying vehicles and/or motorcycles. Stored personal items can also increase the overall weight of your motorcycle, and could cause damage during transport. Any items left in the motorcycle are subject to removal upon inspection at state lines by the DOT.

Locations: Make sure that both your pickup and drop-off locations are tractor-trailer accessible. A 75-80 foot truck must be able to maneuver to and from each address.

Pickup/Delivery Times: Be sure that you have chosen locations that allow someone to be present between the hours of the designated time frame that has been scheduled for the pick up.

Contact Times: Be sure contact persons are available by phone between the hours of 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Monday through Friday, and be sure that the phone numbers you provide are direct lines to those persons. Cell phones are usually the best.
